Islamic Relief Pakistani Floods Appeal - UPDATES

Islamic Relief has launched an emergency appeal and has already begun distributions of tents and blankets. Heavy monsoon rains have triggered the worst floods since 1929 in Pakistan's northwest, killing more than 1600 people and forcing hundreds of thousands to flee from their homes. 20 Million people have been affected.

02 August 2010

- Vehicles have been provided to the local authority in Muzaffarabad to help rescue stranded victims
- Tent distributions have taken place in Nowshera, Muzaffarabad and Neelum Valley
- Emergency food supplies have been delivered to 2,000 families in Muzaffarabad
- Hygiene kits have been distributed in Neelum Valley
- Assessments have taken place in Sibi

05 August 2010

- Hygiene kits distributed to 2,000 families in Nowshera
- A camp for internally displaced people has been completed in Nowshera
- Work has started to set up a camp for 2,000 families in Khyber Pakhtoonkhwa

12 August 2010

- Distributed household kits and hygiene kits in Bakhtyarabad, Sibbi, benefitting approximately 6,000 people
- Supplies for 4,000 family food packs purchased
- Purchased further 1,100 temporary shelters and tents for families

17 August 2010

- 2 camps have been established for internally displaced people in Muzaffargarh, Punjab
- 1 camp in Golwala Union benefitting 2,400 people
- 1 camp in Nohanwala Union benefitting 1,000 people

19 August 2010

- 5 water filtration systems purchased. Each system produces 2,000 litres of clean drinking water per hour.
- A total of 5 camps for internally displaced people have now been established in Muzaffargarh benefitting approximately 3,300 people
- Hygiene kits and household kits distributed in Charsadda, Nowshera and Bakhtiarabad, benefitting over 5,000 people

21 August 2010

Since the beginning the floods crisis, Islamic Relief has been distributing essential items on a daily basis, so far completing the following:

- Family food pack distributions benefitting 10,192 people
- Tent distributions benefitting 4,368 people
- Family hygiene kit and jerry can distributions benefitting 28,875 people
- Household kit distributions benefitting 14,980 people
- Kitchen set distributions benefitting 14,910 people
- The distributions have taken place in the following four districts: Sibbi in Baluchistan, Nowshera and Charsadda in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Haveli Kahuta, Bagh and Neelum in Pakistan Adminstered Kashmir, Muzaffargarh in Punjab
